Please Note

- If entering via Agility Plaza, you will be able to choose your preferred height option but please ensure that the breed is correct. If your dog is a collie-cross, please ensure it is registered as such and not as a crossbreed which would be considered an ABC dog. Check that your dog is showing the correct height, grade and ABC or not and change by clicking the correct option if appropriate.
- Classes do not necessarily run in numerical order, please refer to the Ring Plan when available.
- For classes with a small entry or if you know you are going to be late for a class, please ensure you are marked 'late' on the ring, otherwise the class may close before you have run.
- Dogs in hot vehicles: Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Help at the Show – Judges and Ring Party

The show cannot run without help, if you have not opted to help on Agility Plaza/the entry form please sign up at the Show - an hour or two of your time would really be appreciated. We need people to pick poles and take leads to the ring exit as well as ring managers, scrimers and check in/callers. If you have not been part of a Ring Party before, it is a good way to learn how a Ring works and make friends at the same time. The Ring Manager will help and explain anything necessary.

Refreshments are provided on the Ring for all Ring Party throughout the day. Lunch will be provided for anyone able to help for half a day on any Ring Party job. **In addition** to lunch, judges receive generous expenses and two nights' free camping; Ring Managers and Scrimers receive a £20 discount on entry fees and one night's free camping for each day worked.

IFCS World Agility Championships

The IFCS (International Federation of Cynological Sports) World Championships have four main classes - Agility, Jumping, Snooker and Gamblers. These classes have individual medals but also count towards the All Around medals (awarded to the best overall performers). In addition, there is a Biathlon which combines Agility with Jumping and there are also Team events with Team medals to be won. Plenty to try for in this fantastic competition.



FAB Shows are a member of IFCS and as such are approved to host qualifiers and send a team each year. We are extremely happy to host qualifiers, open to pedigree and non-pedigree dogs alike with four jump heights rather than the usual three, thereby catering for more dogs. Each year we hope to take at least three handlers and dogs for each of the four jump heights.

The classes are open to dogs of any grade so please consider trying out for the next team. There will be qualifiers in Agility, Jumping, Snooker and Gamblers. The courses will be of a style that you will find at the World Championships and will be interesting and exciting to run, whatever your current standard. Anyone can enter these classes, whether you wish to be considered for the team or not.

Eligibility and Progression – FAB

Newbie: For dogs that have never competed before, never competed at a FAB show before, or are currently competing in Grades 1-3 at Kennel Club shows.

Graduate: For dogs that have never competed at a FAB show before but are currently competing in Grades 4 and 5 at Kennel Club shows.

Senior: For dogs that have never competed at a FAB show before but are currently competing in Grades 6 and 7 at Kennel Club shows.

If you have competed at FAB before then you should enter each class at the level at which you are within FAB, regardless of your current KC level. If in any doubt, please email dawnweaver2@gmail.com for clarification.

All Sorts 1 & 2: For retired and recovering dogs and for dogs between 16 and 18 months old. These classes are NFC, are not timed and consist of jumps and tunnels only. Choose which height to jump on the day.

Grand Prix Agility: Open to all dogs regardless of level or Grade. The course will be of an American style – free-flowing with interesting obstacle discrimination – meaning it is not just about speed and skilful handling will be very important.

Each class has its own progression rate (excl Grand Prix which is open to all levels/grades) so for example, two wins at Newbie Agility will progress you to Graduate Agility. Likewise, two wins at steeplechase will progress you to the next level. Therefore, your dog may be Senior in steeplechase but still Newbie in agility. Two wins in any category moves you up to the next level following a 25-day move-up period. ABC dogs have a separate prize-giving to collies/collie-crosses so they never compete against collies/collie-crosses. (The show committee will decide, in the event of a dispute, which category a dog falls into. However, the competitor must declare on the entry form the category the dog falls into.)

Class and Height Definitions – FAB

NB. All classes may include ‘dummy’ obstacles which do not form part of the course, will not be numbered and therefore should not be taken but are included as obstacle discrimination.

If you think your dog is uncomfortable jumping its present height at Kennel Club shows, please approach us and we will assess his suitability for the next height down.

Summary of Rules – FAB

Dogs may be run as NFC (not for competition) in any class except IFCS Qualifiers, as long as the judge is aware before the handler begins. A silent toy may be taken into the ring and the handler will have 60 seconds on the equipment. Food may also be used as a reward as long as it is fed directly to the dog and does not touch the ground. There must be no harsh handling or verbal abuse at any time, in or out of the competition ring.

Dogs must be 18 months or older to compete in agility and jumping classes; dogs between 16 and 18 months old can compete in All Sorts 1 & 2 and Newbie Steeplechase. Bitches in season may compete at the end of the class but must be kept away from the ring areas until then. If weaving poles are included in a class, there must be 12. There will be no up-contacts faulted unless the dog has ascended from the side of the ramp past the line of the contact. Striding over the contact will not be marked.

Dogs may wear a collar with or without a single identity disc or may run without a collar. Dogs must not run wearing a harness or head collar.

Dogs in cars on hot days: If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

The FAB show committee reserve the right to refuse entries. In the event of cancellation due to unforeseen circumstances, fees will be refunded less expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within one month of the show date. Prize Giving – FAB and FAB 2020 League

Places will be awarded for clear rounds only down to 10% of the class.

Agility, Jumping, Steeplechase and Grand Prix Prizes:

1st: Rosette & Klassy Canine Teenie Weenies.

2nd, 3rd etc: Rosette or Rosette & Klassy Canine Teenie Weenies depending on the number of runners in the class.

Unplaced clear rounds: A Klassy Canine rosette-shaped biscuit.

Allsorts 1 & 2: all dogs receive a Klassy Canine rosette-shaped biscuit as they leave the ring (runs will not be timed and there are no placings).

FAB League. Points will accrue throughout the FAB (non-KC) shows for any placings achieved in Agility, Jumping and Steeplechase (points from these three classes will be combined) and points will accrue separately for Grand Prix.

There will be no split by grade, but they will be split between ABC and CCX and also by height.

For placings achieved (these are the normal placings based on clear rounds and dependent on the number of runners in the class): 1st place earns 10 points, 2nd earns 8 points, 3rd earns 6 points, 4th earns 4 points, 5th earns 2 points, 6th earns 1 point.

League Winners: 1st and 2nd places will receive a special rosette and a prize. In addition, Klassy Canine are kindly donating a packet of Teenie Weenies for each League winner. The presentation will take place on Saturday 19 September at FAB-KC Surrey shortly after the show has closed for the day. The last opportunity to win points for the 2020 League is at FAB Surrey on 18 September 2020.



1st and 2nd places will be awarded for Combined Agility/Jumping/Steeplechase (in the event of a tie the dog with the most agility points will be the winner); and 1st and 2nd places will be awarded for Grand Prix (not combined with any other class). The categories are listed below:

Petite ABC (all grades)

Small ABC (all grades), Small CCX (all grades)

Medium ABC (all grades), Medium CCX (all grades)

Standard ABC (all grades), Standard CCX (all grades)

Large ABC (all grades), Large CCX (all grades)

Eligibility – IFCS World Championship Qualifiers

FAB is the only full member organisation of the IFCS association and eligible to run World Championship Qualifiers. Any grade dog may enter and compete in any of the Qualifiers, but NFC runs are not permitted.

Jumping and Agility classes (held at each Qualifier). Points: 1st place earns 10 points, 2nd – 8 points, 3rd – 6 points, 4th – 4 points, 5th – 2 points, 6th – 1 point.

You can earn points from runs with 5 faults providing it is not due to missed contacts, faulted weaves and the dog is within course time. Points cannot be earned from any run with time faults.

There will be a Snooker class at all FAB (non-KC) shows. Point are awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places and are an important part of the qualifying procedure as points gained will be added to jumping and agility totals to produce overall top point scoring dogs.

IFCS Team GB

When selecting Team members, selections are based on several criteria including:

- Dogs that have earned points from agility as well as jumping and not solely jumping.
- Dogs with skills that are essential for success at international events, eg independent contacts and weaves.
- A balance of speed dogs to be competitive in individual events and more reliable dogs for team events.
- A mixture of dogs will be selected from those with high points and those suitable as wild cards.
- Handler-commitment in attending qualifiers.
- Dogs that have shown an aptitude for distance-handling in games events.
- New dogs/handlers showing great potential.

Class and Height Definitions – IFCS

- **Agility** Performance of a sequence of obstacles set by a judge against time and without faults.
 - **Jumping** As for agility but contact zones are excluded.
 - **Snooker** Performance of a sequence of obstacles within two periods (opening and Snooker) to gain maximum points for clearly performed obstacles within time set by a judge.
 - **Gamblers (joker)** Performance of obstacles by choice during opening period and in closing period as set by a judge, to gain maximum points for clearly performed obstacles within time set by a judge.

- **Toy** 300mm and under (12in) Jump height 300mm
 - **Mini** 400mm and under (16in) Jump height 400mm
 - **Medium** 500mm and under (20in) Jump height 500mm
 - **Maxi** Over 500mm (20in) Jump height 600mm
